## 2024 Gros Ventre Grenache Rosé

## Certified Organic | Sub region – Wilyabrup

> Rosily Vineyard is situated on Yelverton Road in one of the premier sub districts in Margaret River - Wilyabrup. The total vineyard size is 12.28 hectares. Only fruit from our vineyard is used in the production of our wines. The wines are all made at the winery constructed on the property in the year 2000.

**Our History** 

Vice-Admiral Count François-Étienne de Rosily-Mesros (1748-1832) sailed past the Margaret River

wine region 195 years before it was established.

Rosily was an ensign on the French gabre ship, the 'Gros Ventre' (aka Big Belly) commanded by Louis de St. Alouarn in 1772. He made the first, but very accurate survey of Flinders Bay which is situated in the southern part of the district.

The explorers also sailed north to Shark Bay where Rosily made another accurate map of that section of the coast.

This map showed the location on Dirk Hartog Island where two bottles with charts sealed with a silver French coin and a lead seal were buried. This document was used more than 200 years later, to find the bottle and coin left by Rosily's party in March 1772.

**Notes** Blend - Grenache 57%, Shiraz 30%, Merlot 13%

Picking dates - 13th, 20th and 27th February 2024

Bottling date - 27th May 2024
