Only fruit from our vineyard is used in the production of our wines. The wines are all made at the winery constructed on the property in the year 2000.

Salute This wine is a celebration of two of Margaret River's famous pursuits - grape growing

and surfing.

The Other Side Of The Moon is a beautiful surfing break situated near Cape Naturaliste not

far from the valued vineyards of the region.

Importantly the wine has been made in the Rosily Vineyard house style, concentrating on elegance and pure fruit expression. It also maintains the focus of the winery to ensure all of

our wines are crafted from our single vineyard site.

Varietal Input Blend: 55% Sauvignon Blanc, 28% Semillon and 17% Chardonnay.

> Sauvignon Blanc: Provides a zesty, refreshingly lemon lift.

Semillon: Provides some tropical notes with a rounder mouthfeel.

Chardonnay: Provides layered complexity.
